

Crochet Shell Stitch



DIFFICULTY LEVEL

Easy.

MATERIALS

Yarn

Any DK weight yarn with 2 different colors.

Tools

3mm crochet hook.

Tapestry needle.

ABBREVIATIONS

This pattern is written using standard US crochet terminology.

- Ch = Chain(s)
- Sc = Single Crochet
- Dc = Double Crochet
- St(s) = Stitch (es)

Stitch conversion table (UK/ US):

UK		US	
Chain	Ch	Chain	Ch
Double	Dc	Single	Sc
Treble	Tr	Double	Dc

Pattern notes:

- The finished size and the amount of yarn used may vary depending on the individual's gauge.
- Change between 2 colors every one row.
- If you want to change the final measurements, you can increase / decrease # of starting chains and # of rows until reach the desired length & width.
- Ch3 at the beginning of the row counts as first dc.

METHOD

- Make a slip knot, start with # of chains multiples of 6 + chain 3 (as a height), in this tutorial we will start with 27 chains.
- Sc in 3rd ch from hook, *skip next 2ch, 5dc in the next ch, skip next 2ch, sc in the next ch*. Repeat * until the end.



- **Change color**, ch3, turn, 2dc in the same st, sc in the middle st of the next 5dc from previous row, *5dc in the next sc, sc in the middle st of the next 5dc*, repeat * across the row, 3dc in the last st.



- **Change color**, ch1, turn, sc in the same st, *5dc in the next sc from previous row, sc in the middle st of the next 5dc*, repeat * across the row.



-Repeat previous 2 steps until you reach the desired length.
